# ONE BALL HEADBAND NO 1

# KNITTED WITH PASCUALI MAXIMO



## **KNITTING CONSTRUCTION**

Knitted with our chunky - Maximo - this headband is not only a nice project for in between, but also a quick gift for your loved ones.

The headband is first worked in fisherman's rib. It has a twist on the front which gives it its magical touch.

## YARN AND NOTIONS

- · Pascuali Maximo (100 % organic merino extrafine)
  - Yardage 100 g  $\sim$  80 m | 3.50 oz  $\sim$  87 yds:
- · 1 x 100 g ball in a colour of your choice Colour of the pictured sample: #428 Chocolate brown
- · US 10.75 (ø 7 mm) circular needle
- $\cdot\,$  or needle size required to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle and scissors

#### **GAUGE**

Before you get started, you should make a swatch of about 5" (12 cm) square. Cast on a couple of stitches more than indicated in the gauge. After blocking, your gauge should match the following:

Knitted in slip stitch pattern with deeper pierced stitches with US 10.75 (7 mm) needle:

11 sts x 11 rows = 4'' (10 cm) square

Tip: If you have counted more stitches, use a larger needle size. If you have counted fewer stitches, use a smaller needle size. Repeat swatch until you match the indicated gauge.

#### SIZE

One size fits all women sizes Head circumference: 54 – 57cm Dimensions flat: 13 x 23 cm

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

p = purl sts = stitches RS = Right Side WS = Wrong Side k =knit rpt = repeat k1b = knit one below

#### **TECHNIQUES**

## Selvedge stitch

Lift the first stitch of each row, purl the last stitch of each row.

## Fisherman's rib

\*k1b, p1, off \* repeat.



#### **KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS**

Part 1: Cast-on

Cast on 16 sts.

Part 2: Fisherman's rib

The headband is worked in fisherman's rib.

Work approx. 50 cm (106 Rounds) in fisherman's rib. You can easily adjust the length of the headband by simply measuring your head circumference.

## Part 3: Binding off

To get a clean transition, it is important to cast off the stitches as they appear.

## Part 4: Connecting the ends



Slide the two ends into each other so that they lie alternately on top of each other.



Sew all layers together.

Turn the headband from the inside out so that the seam is on the inside.

## Part 5: Finishing

Bathe or moisten the headband and let it dry while lying flat.

Note: We highly recommend wet blocking your finished garment. Most fibres will plump up and relax, the stitches will even out and cohere into a beautifully even, soft and sturdy fabric.

The headband is ready!

# Our Knitwear Care Recommendation

We recommend washing the garment carefully by hand in lukewarm water. Soak the knitted garment without shaking and then rinse it. Wrap the garment in a towel and gently squeeze out the water.
